

“Governing as governance”¹ in a NMO

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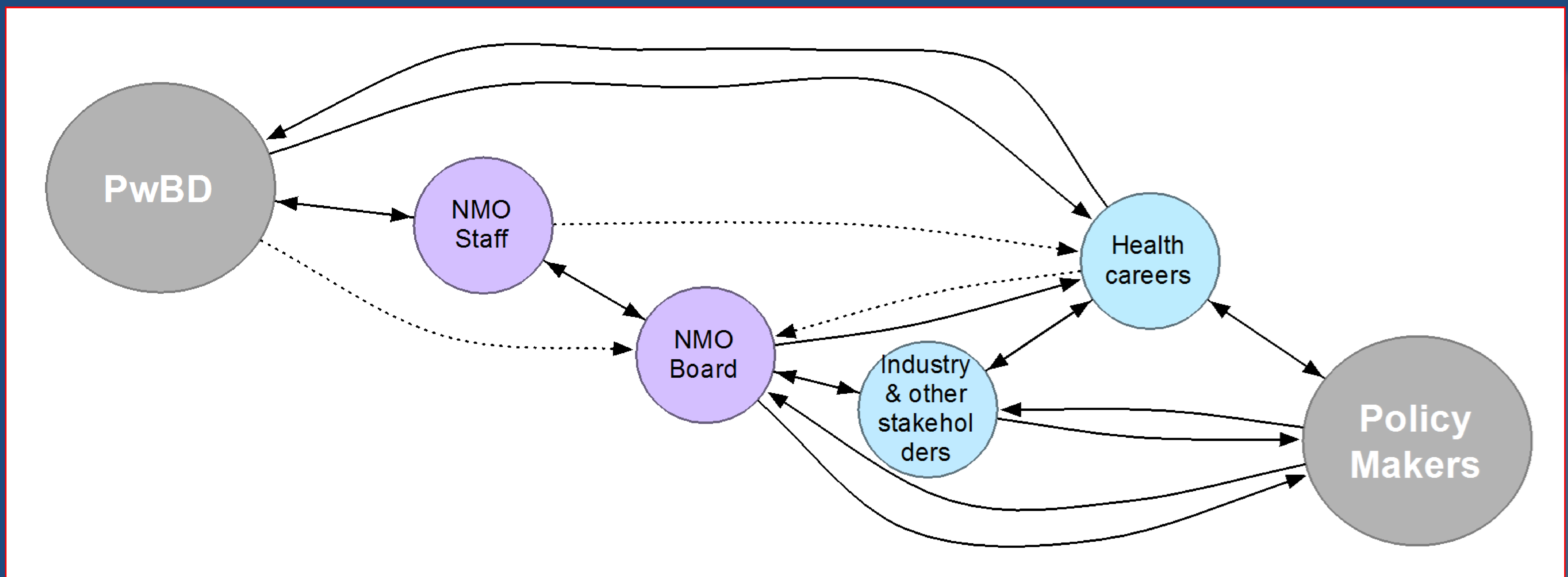
OBJECTIVES

Also, we hope we can open new studies about this paradigm with the support of other NMOs

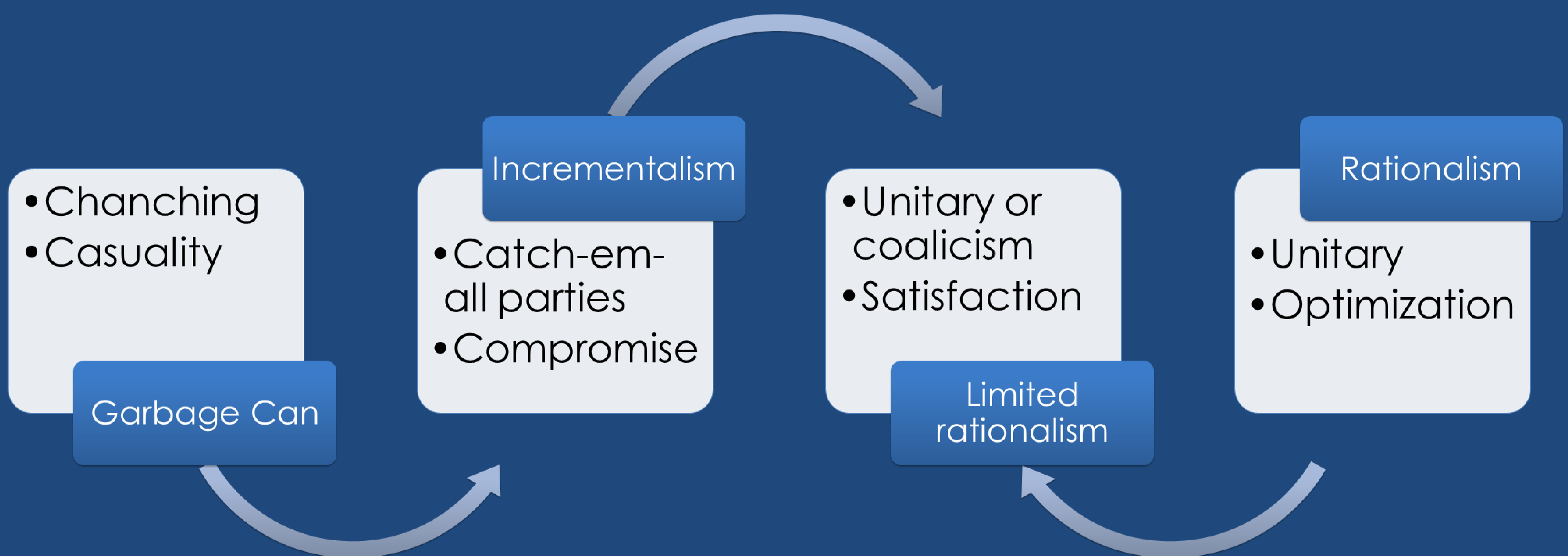
GOVERNANCE? WHAT'S GOVERNANCE?
