

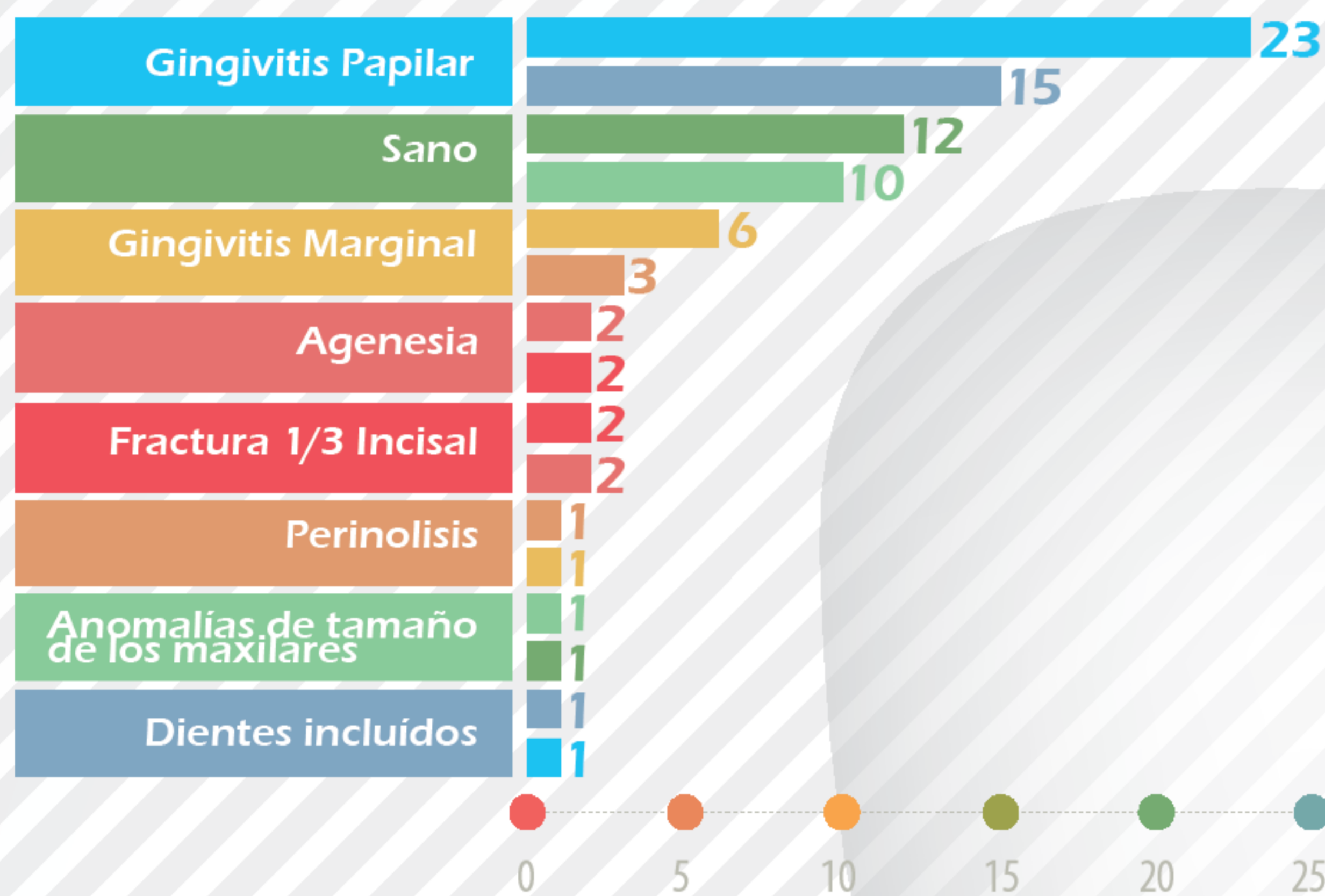
Five years of comprehensive attention: Dentistry

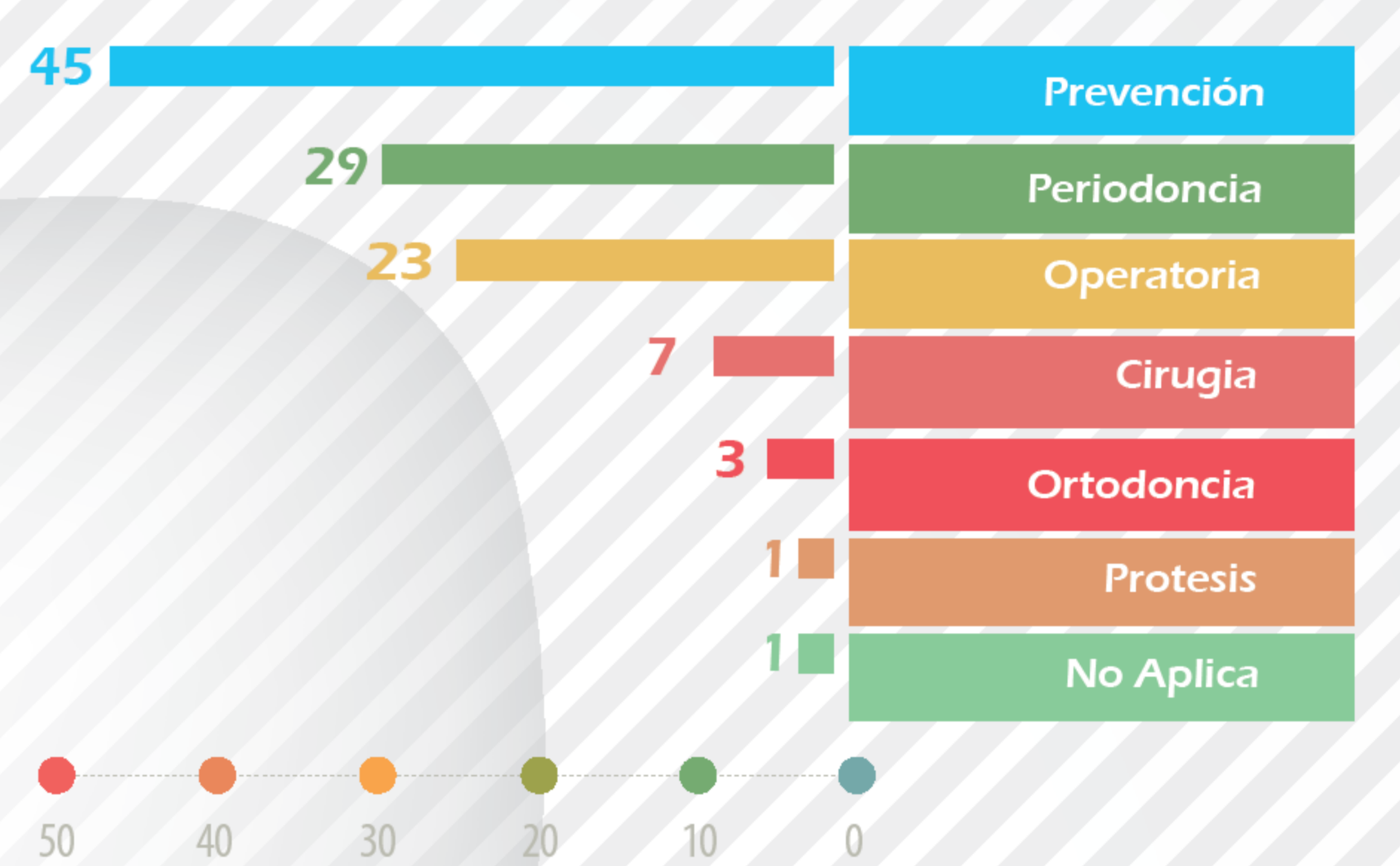
The initial purpose of Dentistry service in patients with bleeding disorders, is to prevent bleeding complications resulting from dental care. In the comprehensive attention program instead, we focus on a preventive oral health approach that contributes to an optimal health of the patient.

Materials and Methods: Our experience we confirmed that, oral morbidity of patients with inherited bleeding disorders is similar to those of other groups.

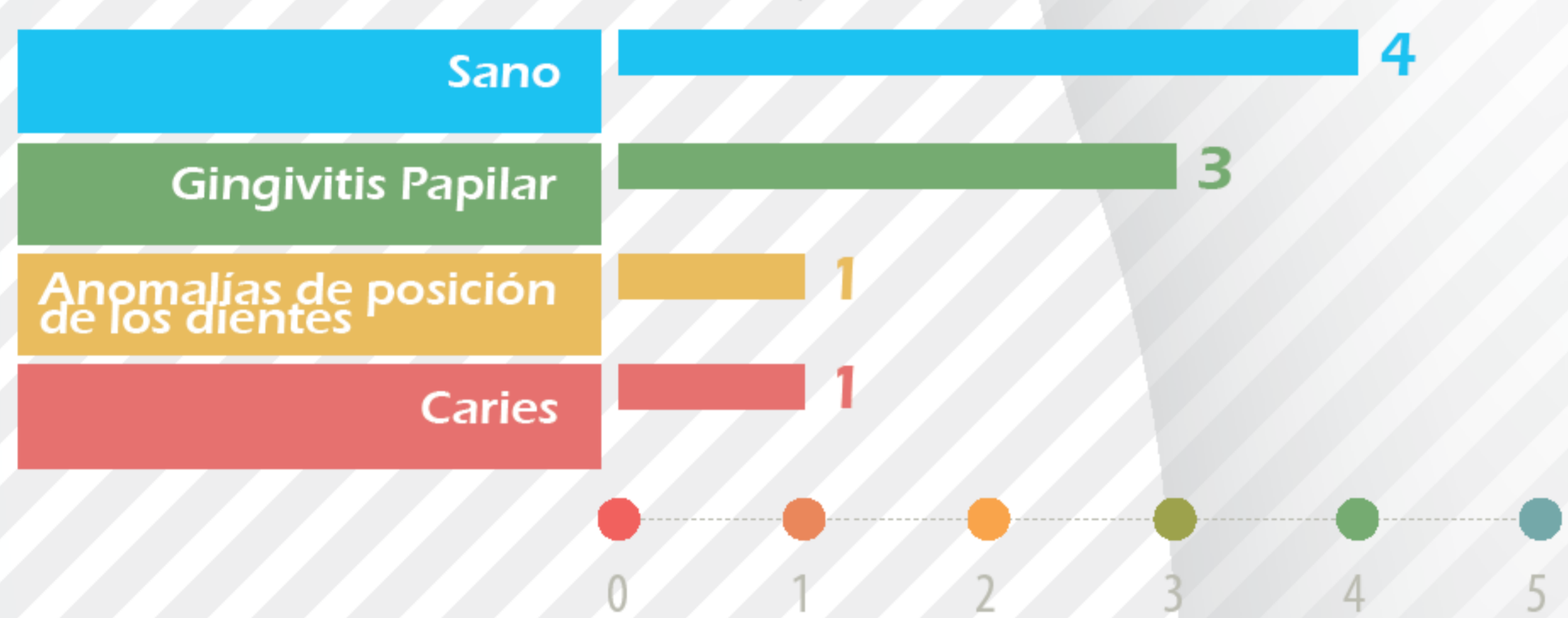
Oral diagnostic frequency, Hemophilia A patients



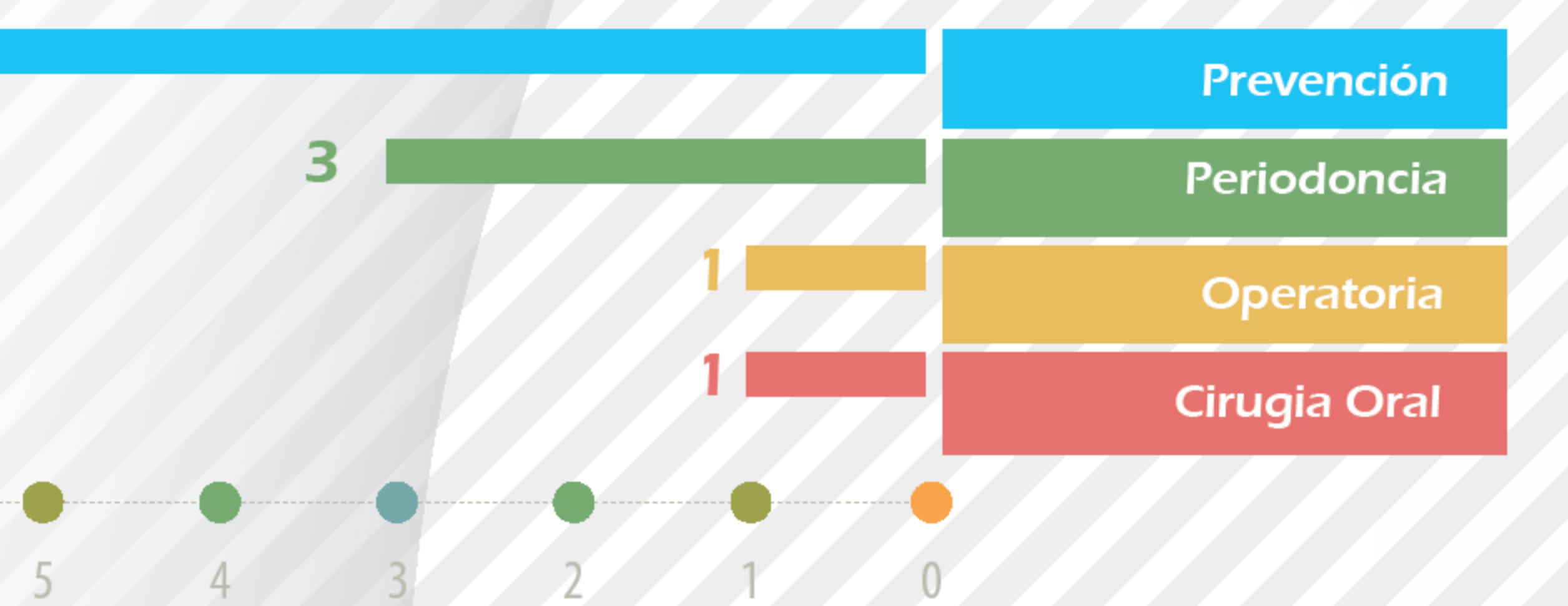
Dental procedures in Hemophilia A patients

Regarding treatments carried out, we emphasize on identifying the level of risk for caries and periodontal disease. Preventive and specific protection activities are the basis of our work.

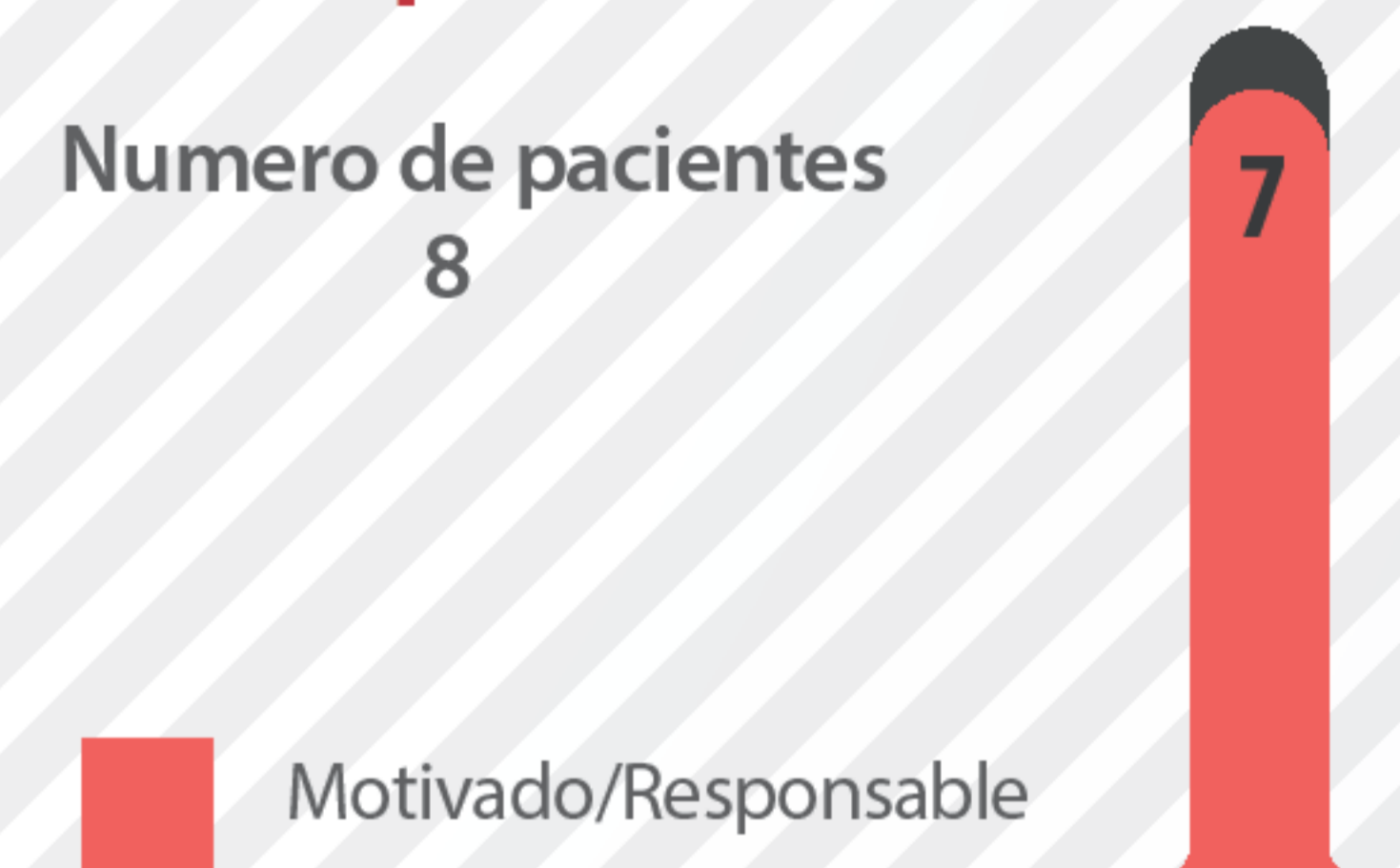
We do not report any bleeding complication from treatments carried out. They were outpatient with a careful postoperative follow up and carried out following the WFH (World Federation of Hemophilia) recommendations.

The commitment of patients with oral health is positive and is reinforced with regular individual educational activities, depending on the level of risk for each patient.
