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#### INTRODUCTION:

Vietnam Hemophilia Association (VHA) was established in 2007 and twinned with the Irish Haemophilia Society (IHS) for 4 years (2011 – 2014)

#### RESULTS:

Through visits and communication, both IHS and VHA have shared information about organization, their countries, people and culture. IHS have organized training courses for VHA volunteers and staff in governance, recruiting and managing volunteers, advocacy, fundraising, financial management and communication, ect...

### RESULTS (cont):

The relationship between the IHS and VHA is very warm and collaborative. VHA has been transformed over the period of the twinning. The organization has a new and more effective and inclusive national governance structure, new branches and structures including 3 chapters, 3 clubs and 4 peer groups.

## RESULTS (cont):

VHA has recruited and maintained volunteers, raised awareness patients and families about hemophilia, organized summer camps annually in 3 regions and created and published many publications about hemophilia.

With support from WFH and IHS, VHA has organized meetings with Vietnam authorities to advocate successfully for more access to home treatment for haemophilia.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

The initial 4 year twinning programme has now evolved into an ongoing partnership.
